

Tennis, Pickle Ball, Bocce Ball and Horseshoe Court Procedures

The Association has adopted procedures for use of Association courts designed to offer limited use of the courts while adhering to CDC, State and local restrictions and guidelines. The procedures are detailed and mandatory in order to protect our high risk population as much as possible. Compliance with these procedures is required. Residents who do not comply will not be permitted to use the facilities and may be subject to further action in accordance with established due process procedures.

Prior to use of FRCA Facilities, residents must sign and submit the COVID-19 waiver.

All courts are for resident use only. No non-resident family member or guests are allowed use of and access to the courts until further notice.

- The courts will be open from 8am – 4 pm Sunday through Saturday.
- Masks must be worn at all times in the court areas unless the resident is actually participating in the activity.
- Residents will maintain a distance of 10 feet while participating in activities on the courts.
- Residents will maintain a distance of 6 feet and must wear a mask while waiting or watching.
- Registration for court use will be via SignUp Genius which is available on the official website, FallsRun.org. Reservations for weekend use must be made prior to noon on the preceding Friday so that concierge staff can be coordinated. Residents that cannot access the website or SignUp Genius can make reservations by calling the center at (540) 371-4452.
- For weekend hours, a Falls Run concierge must meet the court participants at the court at the start time of the reservation to unlock the courts, complete health survey questions and clear the residents for entry into the courts. If a concierge is not available, the court will remain closed and locked.
- For weekday hours, members of the Management Staff must meet the court participants at the court at the start time of the reservation to unlock the courts, complete health survey questions and clear the residents for entry into the courts. They can be reached at (540) 371-4452.
- No community Bocce Ball or Horseshoe equipment is available. Residents may bring their own personal equipment.
